Target Structure:	Introductions; <i>To be</i> ; <i>From</i> ; Questions forms
Vocabulary:	General
Level:	Elementary (First lesson...)
Time:	10 minutes
Preparation:	Cut up the cards

Suggested Teaching Method

These cards are great for a first lesson. Even if your students know each other (e.g. in a company class, the role-play aspect means it still works successfully.

The following language can be practiced:

What's your name? I'm XXX
What do you do? I'm a XXX
Where are you from? I'm from XXX.

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Cut up the cards, and give one to each student. Model an example with a confident student. Students should meet everyone in the room.

If necessary, redistribute cards after the exercise has finished.
